Jim (James Albert) Jenner was born in 1930 in Falkirk, Scotland, one of a family of two boys, of which he was the eldest

His was educated in Scotland. After leaving school, the family moved to England and Jim went to sea.

He later joined the Royal Airforce, Marine Section and was eventually seconded to Singapore with the Marine Police and did Air/Sea rescue work which he loved. He wanted to do another stint in Singapore but, at that time, he had a family (a son, Peter, and a daughter, Ann) and they did not want to stay there so they emigrated to New Zealand in 1958.

Jim worked for Telecom for many years and was a foreman in charge of the line gangs and later a faults troubleshooter. He and his family lived in Takapuna.

Jim married Sue in 1982 and they decided not to have children.

He retired from Telecom in 1992 and then sold the house in Takapuna and they moved to Napier where he worked as a ranger for the trout fisheries. Needless to say, he was a very keen fisherman.

In his spare time, as well as fishing, Jim also liked to read and potter in the garden. Whilst in Takapuna, he used to love boating and anything to do with the sea.

After some years in Napier, he and his wife Sue moved to Australia; first to Redcliffe in Queensland and then to Golden Beach, on the Sunshine Coast. While in Australia, Jim was heavily involved with the RSL.

Jim died in 2008 from a heart attack. He was cremated and his ashes spread on the waters of Pumicestone Passage, as he had wished.

Jim was initiated into the Prince of Wales' Lodge in 1972 and served as master in 1981. He also joined St George Lodge No. 1801 to support that lodge when it moved to Auckland from Dargaville.

In district, he was appointed DGStwd in 1984 and PDGStdBr in 1988.
